Black: 8 – 1 ½ x 6 ½ rectangle


Appleseed BOM

Purple Flower Box

Assorted Purples: 16 – 2 ½ x 3 ½ inch rectangle


1. Pair two 2 ½ x 3 ½ in purple rectangles right sides together and sew together on the long side. Press to the left. This unit will measure 4 ½ x 3 ½ . 2. Repeat with a second set. Press to the right. 3. Sew the two sets together as shown in step three. Nest your seams and press open. Finished unit will measure 4 ½ x 6 ½. 4. Repeat with a variety of purple fabrics to make four units.






5. Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch black rectangle to the left side of the unit. Press to the black. 6. Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch black rectangle to the right side of the unit. Press to the black. Finshed unit will measure $6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch square. 7. Repeat with a variety of purple fabrics to make 4 units.








8. Arrange the pieces and sew together as seen below. Your finished block will measure 12 ½ inches.

THINK OUTSIDE THE BOX COLOR CHALLENGE

Challenge yourself to look at colors differently and add new color combinations to your repertoire!

Here's how it works:

- 1. Pick a color card. (One person per card, but you may do more than one card) *
 - a. Does the card bring joy?
 - b. Will the card challenge you?
- 2. Sign your name and the color card number on the sign-up sheet.
- 3. Snap a photo with flash of both the front and back of the card.
- 4. Return the card to the box.
- 5. Make anything you want using only the colors from your card.
 - a. Example: any pattern, big, small, art quilt, wall hanging, etc
 - b. You must use all the colors on your card.
 - c. You can use lighter/darker colors of those on your card.
 - d. You cannot add a color that is not on your card.
- 6. Challenge projects will be due and shown at the October Guild Meeting.

7. To qualify for prizes, the project must be completed. If you are making a quilt, at least the quilt top must be completed.

8. Our October Guild Meeting program will be the Challenge Reveal!

* The reason we want to have only one person per card is because we may have this challenge displayed in the next quilt show and we want to clip the color card to the quilt for display!

DONATION QUILTS FOR SHRINERS

Our June meeting was filled with inspiration and purpose as we welcomed Ron Buskirk from The Fort Wayne Mizpah Shriners. Ron shared heartfelt insights into how our donated quilts will make a difference in the lives of children under the Shriners' care. Although he did not specify exact details or parameters for the quilts, we have collectively decided on a plan to ensure our contributions are meaningful and practical.

One-Time Donation

This year, we have committed to a one-time donation of quilts to The Fort Wayne Mizpah Shriners. The Shriners have been approached by the Linus Project and may partner with them in the future, but for now, our focus is on providing a special gift from our guild at our December guild meeting.

Quilts for Comfort and Security

Each quilt we donate will be given to a child to use during their trips, either alone or with their guardian. The quilt will be their personal possession to keep them warm and comfortable during their travels. To make it even more convenient, a bag to carry the quilt in would be an excellent addition.

Size Specifications

For practical reasons, the quilts should be lap-sized, suitable for use in a vehicle. Larger quilts could become cumbersome, so we recommend keeping them to a manageable size for the children.

Our Goal

We aim to present at least 25 quilts at our December meeting. If you are unable to attend, please feel free to drop off your quilt at the Programs Table ahead of time. This ensures we can gather all the donations and have them ready for the children who need them.

Let's rally together to create these beautiful quilts and bring comfort to children in need. Happy quilting!


